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Pāṭhaśālā inauguration at Tillaiyambur

The Chatur Veda Śāstra Pāṭhaśālā was inaugurated at Tillaiyambur (near Kumbhakonam) on 17 Oct 2010 (Vijayadasami day). The day was marked by Veda pārāyaṇa (recitation), performing Homas and planting saplings at the Pāṭhaśālā premises. About fifty people attended the function.

Homas included Ganapati Homa, Vāstu Homa, Navagraha Homa and

Āvahantī Homa.

Veda students recited the Aruna Praśna (first Praśna of Taittirīya Āraṇyakam aka Sūrya Namaskāram).

To commemorate the day, saplings were planted by well-wishers and students.





An elderly person (about 80 years and who lives in the village) said,

"I am happy to see a Pāṭhaśālā being started.

It would revive the good activities in this village".

Āvahantī Homa :

Āvahantī Homa is performed by chanting the mantra starting with the word Āvahantī. This mantra is in the first adhyāya of Taittirīya Upaniṣad.

The main prayer in this mantra is for good students to come to the Guru.

A Homa is a means by which devatās are worshiped through offerings to Agni. Agni acts as the messenger to deliver the offerings and prayers to the devatās. For Āvahantī Homa the central devatā is Dhātā (Brahmā).



Homa performance

Āhuti (Offerings) are made twelve times to Dhātā while chanting the mantra once. During each Āhuti a specific prayer is made. Out of the twelve Āhutis, six asks Dhātā for good students, three for moksha, two for fame and one for wealth.


